

What if I can't afford the time or money to come to a Support School?

Do not let the lack of time or money keep you from attending a Support School. You may think that you can't fit the preparation requirements or three days of training into your schedule. Or you may think that you can't afford the seminar fee or cost of getting there. Our answer? You can't afford **NOT** to invest the time and money! It takes the investment of time and money to raise your support properly. What is 3-4 days of your life when you may very well be trying to raise a lifelong support team? What is a few hundred dollars investment compared to the thousands you will be trying to raise each year? For most participants, the seminar costs represent less than 20% of what only one of their monthly paychecks should be. Quite a return on your investment! Additionally, the *School Pre-training Packet* will be sent to you as soon as you register. *This will also equip you to raise the necessary one-time support to help pay for the training if finances are an obstacle to your attending.*

How do I prepare for Support School?

With a lot of prayer and hard work! The more you put in to the preparation, the more you will get out of the training. The school is designed to teach a development process model that focuses on developing individual ministry partnerships. To get the fullest value from the training, you need to invest in the advance preparation prior to arriving at the school. I have had some other training in this area, or have read some books on this. Should I still come to a Support School?

Some ministries do an excellent job of training their personnel how to raise support, some do not. Do not underestimate the value of getting top notch training in this area. Our heart is to train you to develop support for long-term, sustainable ministry, primarily in the context of Southern Baptist missions. If you feel like your training has not been thorough enough or you have raised support but are not yet at 100% a Support School will be very valuable to you. Although several books offer excellent resources, you will be lacking the hands-on applications and "how-to" workshops utilized in the Support School. The combination of the extensive preparation and the 24 hours of intense training is a powerful one-two punch that can launch you into a successful support development experience. 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Frequently Asked Questions

What is Support Development School?

Ministry Partner Development (MPD) is a biblical process to involve other Christians as ministry partners in the fulfillment of the Great Commission. You are asking people to enter into a partnership where they commit their financial resources to God for you so you will be able to commit your time and skills fully to introducing people to the Savior. The Support School provides the training to accomplish that task.

During the 3½ day Support Development School you will spend approximately 28 classroom hours learning principles that will enable you to raise your personal and/or ministry support for a lifetime of service through NAMB. The philosophy we operate from is to equip you for long-term, sustainable ministry. The training is a mixture of lectures with hands-on practice and workshops. There is preparatory work that must be completed prior to attending the training. This will be sent upon registration.



Support School also teaches clearly how the process of MPD fits within the framework of the Southern Baptist plan of mission support and is complementary to, rather than in competition with, regular tithes and offerings to the local church and giving through the SBC Cooperative Program and the special mission offerings.

Who should attend a Support Development School?

Church Planters and Church Planting Teams. Collegiate Ministers. Chaplains. Ministry Entrepreneurs. Graduating college students seeking to fulfill God's calling on their lives. Okay, we'll admit it... basically anyone who is responsible for raising all or part of their financial support should attend! The variety of ministries represented at the school will be varied, but the training is applicable to all ministries. It is also helpful for those mobilizers whose ministry is assisting others to answer the call to missions through raising support, and for mission leaders who coordinate the work of those developing their support. Support Development School is required for those who will be serving as Mission Service Corps missionaries and will be processing their MSC ministry support through the North American Mission Board. It is also open to others who are raising their support for Great Commission ministry though not serving through Mission Service Corps. However, these would not qualify for the subsidized registration cost.

Why do we call the seminar Support Development School?

The focus is on more than just raising money, but developing a support system to fulfill God's call on our lives!" The primary role of the individual or couple engaged in MPD is not fund raising but vision casting.

When is the next Support School?

We hold three to four Support Development Schools every year spread regionally across North America. Typically there are three in the U.S. and one is held in Canada. It is important to attend a school as early in the process as possible to maximize your efforts and effectiveness and minimize your frustration from "not doing it well!" What does it cost to attend the Support Development School?

For those who are or will be serving as Mission Service Corps missionaries through NAMB, the registration cost is \$125 for an individual or \$150 per couple. This includes the training manual, all workshop and homework materials, plus lunch each day during the training. Additional costs would be the travel, food and lodging expenses which are up to each individual. Note: For attendees who will not be serving as MSC missionaries, the registration cost is \$275 per individual or \$300 per couple.
