Many of the parents do not have a 50 word vocabulary in sign language to communicate with their Deaf child. The missionary will have the opportunity to show Christ's love by the way they live their life. They will make an impact on these children and their families as they communicate fluently with the children. They are able to connect children with their families by being a mediator, an interpreter, and a teacher of the language so that the children one day are able to communicate directly with their hearing siblings and hearing family members. As history has revealed at this camp, eight weeks of total immersion into American Sign Language will immensely improve their communication abilities and their knowledge of Christ.
