Students here are primarily postmodern “screenagers”, and we need help connecting with them through technology (website, Facebook, texting, etc.) and through real discussions of authentic faith and the genuine life that is found in Christ. We're also seeking to get a group registered at Heartland Community College (5,000 students.) Our purpose is to glorify God by loving Him with all of our heart, mind, soul, and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mark 12:29-31.) We do this by going and making disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey all that He has commanded us (Matt. 28:18-20.) Among these universities there is a small minority of the students who are Christian; many come from a Catholic background. So, a lot of "seed sowing" needs to be done. My wife and I (and four kids) arrived here a year ago after serving 12 years overseas among unreached people groups with the International Mission Board. Right now we only have 15-20 students at Illinois State University that need a lot of discipling and mobilizing for evangelism/ministry. We also really need to go out and do a lot of evangelism to reach the 97% that are unchurched. Lord willing, we hope to start ministries at Illinois Wesleyan and Heartland Community College. We also have a burden to mobilize students for the nations and to reach the people groups God has brought here. Semester missionaries will be used of God to share the gospel with many people. They will also be used by God to do a lot of follow-up/discipleship for those who God draws to Himself and those who are already involved. They will learn and be trained in effective ways of evangelism and discipleship. They will also be mentored/trained/discipled by us (there will be reading, listening, application assignments, etc.) Their vision for the nations/missions will be greatly impacted. Because we're simply not a collegiate ministry but also a church plant, the semester missionaries will also learn about and be trained in house church multiplication, which is our vision for our work here. We seek to share Christ on and off campus, make disciples, and send disciples to be attendees of other SBC churches, SBC church planters, and NAMB/IMB missionaries. Student missionaries will be laborers in this process through evangelism, discipleship, and active participation in worship services and Bible studies. They will also help with the outreach/ministry events designed to build relationships with people to share the gospel with them and make Emmaus their church home. Emmaus strives not only to be a church but a campus hot spot where people can hang out, surf the web, see live music, read, and study. Students will have many opportunities to build relationships with so many activities going on at Emmaus throughout the week. Our hope is that relationships can be established and the discipleship process can begin, then we can solidify their membership to the church and begin to delegate responsibilities according to their giftedness and challenge them to lead. This process is important because college students don't have any income, but are very willing to serve passionately for the advancement of the kingdom. Semester missionaries working at Emmaus will see what God can do on a large college campus in which only 4% of students are involved in any ministry at all. NIU was turned upside down by a school shooting in February of 2008, and since then, students have been more open about spiritual things.
